## **Congratulations Jess!**



We hope that you will all join us in congratulating Jess on passing her final exams to become a qualified registered veterinary nurse.

Jess joined Castle Vets back in 2016 working as a kennel assistant and it was during this time that she was inspired to pursue a career in veterinary nursing. Jess completed her GCSEs and achieved the required grades to allow her to begin her training. At least five GCSE passes at Grade C or above including English, maths and science are the entry requirements for a veterinary nursing apprenticeship. We asked Jess if she had any advice for anyone who is thinking about becoming a veterinary nurse and she said "veterinary nursing is not easy and it's not all puppy cuddles! It is really important to have the relevant experience within a veterinary setting before committing to the nursing course".

Jess began her training in 2021 (level 3 diploma in veterinary nursing). This consisted of a practical portfolio log which was completed in practice and written, oral and final OSCEs (practical exams). The course involves a large degree of commitment and dedication which Jess proved to have throughout her training. She worked on the rota alongside her studying whilst also dedicating a lot of her own time towards her course.

Well done Jess, this is so deserved. You have worked very hard over the past few years, and we are all very proud of you.

## Hedgehog Awareness Week, 5<sup>th</sup> – 11<sup>th</sup> May 2024

Hedgehog awareness week is organised by the British Hedgehog Preservation Society and their aim is to raise awareness of the problems hedgehogs face and how we can all help them. This year they are asking people to 'Welcome Wildlife!' by creating a space for wildlife in your own gardens. Here are some of the ways that have been suggested by the British Hedgehog Preservation Society to make your garden more welcoming to hedgehogs.

- A 13cm x 13cm square gap in the bottom of boundary walls and fences can create a hedgehog highway which allows vital access to more habitat. Any hedgehog highways that you create can then be logged at: www.bighedgehogmap.org.
- You can offer shelter and attract food for hedgehogs by creating wild corners and edges, log piles and leaf piles.

 Provide clean drinking water in several shallow bowls around the garden. This is really important during hot spells as water can be hard to come by for all wildlife, not just hedgehogs. Putting a few pebbles in the bowls will provide a safe drinking spot for bees and butterflies too.



- Although ponds and pools are great for wildlife it is important to make sure that there are escape routes. Sloping edges, ramps or half-submerged rocks will provide a safe exit for hedgehogs.
- Do not use any poisons or pesticides that could directly harm wildlife and destroy the food chain.
- Hedgehog spines can get tangled up in netting. Make sure that garden netting is raised 30cm off the ground to allow hedgehogs to pass safely under.
- Always make sure to check for wildlife before strimming, mowing or lighting a bonfire.

Owners found not to have microchipped their cat will have 21 days to have one implanted or may face a fine of up to £500.
