

Bluetongue small-holders vaccine drive

Castle Vets are holding a BTV-3 vaccine drive at our Liskeard branch on March 24th. As the smallest BTV-3 vaccine bottle is 50ml (50 doses, cash price £156 inc VAT) many of our clients have expressed a wish to split doses. Therefore, we are offering a vaccine day, when you can book 20-minute slots with one of our Nurses, Claire, at our Liskeard surgery.



You will be invoiced the number of doses given (£4.50/dose inc VAT) plus a flat vaccine administration fee, covering time and consumables, of £36 (inc VAT).

Alpacas and goats require a second vaccination, three weeks later (Monday April 14th). Please book this in at the same time as your initial appointment, if needed.

Due to the nature of this disease outbreak, the government are keeping track of where the vaccine is used, and how much is being sold. Therefore, after your appointment, you will be given the vaccine batch details so you can fill out the compulsory APHA tracking form within 24hours.

Out-of-Hours Fees

As spring is well and truly upon us, we wanted to take the opportunity to clarify our out-of-hours charging. Our Launceston practice is open 0830-1230 on Saturday for medicines ordering and collection. We also have a receptionist on site during this time, should you wish to ring in and book a TB test or future, routine, appointment.



However, visits within these hours are now charged at our out-of-hours rate. This is due to increasing demand on our service- we only have two vets available to cover our whole practice area, and we need to make sure they are free to attend emergencies.

If you need medication prescribing and dispensing outside of working hours, our on-call vet can do this for you. Our emergency dispensing fee is £13.57 ex VAT.
